

Dear Partners, Associates, and Cherished Community,

Since its inception, the significance of Baha Mar Resort Foundation's mission has been rooted in the belief that a community is stronger when it benefits broadly among its people. We understand the world is in the midst of rapid change, and we have a deep commitment to building a stronger future for The Bahamas. As we prepare to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Independence we are proud to be part of this significant milestone, aligning our foundation's efforts in celebrating the rich history of the nation. It is our responsibility to champion sustainable conservation efforts, honor the diverse cultural traditions and artistic expressions of The Bahamas, and strengthen the community for generations to come.

Fostering our commitment to conservation efforts, the Baha Mar Resort Foundation recognizes the importance of partnering with leading environmental organizations and implementing innovative sustainability practices. These include supporting The Bahamas National Trust through monetary funding, contributing to Flamingo protection and conservation efforts in the Bahamas, coastal cleanups on Saunders Beach and supporting the new Lend a Hand Bahamas Hydroponics Farm. The organization was able to raise awareness for key conservation holidays such as Earth Week and World Water Day by utilizing the newsletter's network. The Foundation launched the Queen Conch Education Program, in which resort representatives visited 14 schools in Nassau and shared the educational documentary "For the Love of Conch," which shows how overharvesting has caused the Queen Conch to become an endangered species in the Caribbean.

Additionally, throughout its long-standing partnership with The Bahamas National Trust to support conservation initiatives, an over sixty-year conservation effort in The Bahamas, the Foundation has supported robust educational Initiatives, impactful scientific research, and award-winning national park management. Since 2019, we continue to hold the coveted award by Preferred by Nature for Sustainable Tourism, which encourages the responsible use of natural resources and promotes a healthy market system that values sustainable production, sourcing, and equitable trade within our industry.

We are committed to making a meaningful impact in the community and have strengthened our ties with more than 30 local organizations including The Bahamas Cancer Society, The Nazareth Centre for Children, Twilight Home for the Elderly, The Humane Society, and BAARK.

The Foundation also supported a National Vaccine Program that resulted in over 20,000 Bahamians vaccinated, blood drives to support the Princess Margaret Hospital, donations to several children and elderly homes on the island, and partnerships with local charities and government agencies, such as The Ministry of Health and The Ministry of Education.

The Foundation has collaborated with The Bahamas Red Cross to pack over 1,000 parcels to date for those in need, Hands for Hunger with over 5,000 lbs. of prepared food donated, and partnered with Shock Treatment, an intervention program intended for "at risk" youth encouraging positive decisions.

Through the proceeds of our Baha Mar Tennis Cup, we were able to collect over \$170,000 in donations and facilitate community improvements, most recently the resurfacing of The Tom 'The Bird' Grand Sport complex Tennis Courts, the first of many more to come.

In previous years the Baha Mar Resort Foundation supported aid for Hurricane Dorian relief and recovery, with a \$2.5million donation commitment and over 800 pieces of furniture.

We are also accelerating our efforts in diverse cultural traditions and artistic expressions. The Current Art Center and Gallery serves as our hub for local and international Bahamian artists to collaborate, create, and share their work with the rest of the world. Last year, the Foundation collaborated with The Current to host an event highlighting the studio's first mural in its mural series "Got Culture: Sustainability for the Future." In addition, the Foundation partnered with the Nassau Music Society to present "C-Force: A Musical Journey of the Caribbean," the musical organization's special season finale concert. Most recently, Baha Mar launched ECCHO (Expressive Collaborations & Creative House of Opportunities), a brand new 13,000 sq. ft. multifunctional creative platform for local and international artists. The new space is an addition to Baha Mar's existing art program, which aims to forge relevant and meaningful connections with creative communities both near and far.

We recognize the collective work of the Council Members for their deep commitment to equitable, economically vibrant, and promotion for a more sustainable environment. As a result of Hurricane Dorian, the children at the Grand Baha Children's Home have been faced with much loss, devastation and trauma, which severely damaged the home in Grand Bahama causing the children to be temporarily relocated to Nassau. As they are now back in their home and beginning to return to a sense of normalcy, on Thursday, August 11th, The Baha Mar Resort Foundation assisted by treating the children to a fun day at Baha Bay Water Park with lunch.

The group consisted of 26 children and 10 chaperons.











# SHOCK TREATMENT

14 teens between the age of 10-17 years visit Baha Mar to expose them to positive options.

Shock Treatment is an intervention Program that is intended for specific categories of "At Risk" young people who are predisposed to or are already engaged in deviant behaviors that can result in their violation of the laws of The Bahamas. The program is part of the government's strategy to reduce and control crime throughout the country. Shock Treatment supports both projects "Safe Bahamas" and "Operation Cease Fire" which are the key crime-fighting initiatives of the Ministry of National Security.






# PREFERRED BY NATURE SUSTAINABLE TOURISM CERTIFICATION

### BNT MANGROVE DONATION PROGRAM

In May 2022, the Mangrove Donation Program was officially launched. This program facilitates the collection of donations for the Bahamas National Trust (BNT) Mangrove restoration and conservation programs.

Donations are being collected through the Conservation Center and through the Baha Mar website. 100% of all donations from the mangrove restoration and conservation program is transferred o the BNT for mangrove protection, conservation, and restoration across The Bahamas.

In honor of World Ocean's Day, BNT invited the Foundation team and other corporate sponsors to join them in a special cleanup and mangrove planting with NFL team members. The cleanup and mangrove planting took place at Bonefish Pond National Park in Nassau.







# QUEEN CONCH SCHOOL EDUCATION PROGRAM

In March 2022, we set to kick off the first phase of the Queen Conch School Education Program. The aim of this outreach project was to educate on Queen Conch Conservation sing materials that Baha Mar and The Baha Mar Resort Foundation has collaborated on in the past years.

The importance of this project cannot be underestimated. Going into schools throughout Nassau brought the realization on how little people actually know about this important species. If we have a positive impact

on one student from each school, the program will be beneficial.

The outreach project was designed in a way that was the most accessible for schools. Students watched the first 15 minutes of the "For the Love of Conch" DVD, afterwards, an educational presentation on Queen Conch Biology, conservation and aquaculture was given. Each school was also given a copy of the DVD and a Queen Conch life history poster.

In spring 2022 sessions focused on reaching government schools. With the assistance of The Ministry of Education, we visited 10 middle and high schools.



### **IMPACT BY NUMBERS**



10 Government schools were visited over the course of two weeks. This was coordinated with the help of the Ministry of Education - Science Subject Coordinator

#### 500 Students

During our 2 week period, close to 500 students were spoken to. These students ranged from being in grades 7 - 10.



#### 12 DVD's

Each school was gifted a copy of the "For the Love of Conch" DVD. This would allow them to finish the film with their students, and use this in future lessons to come. As such, this would help in expanding our reach into the future.



#### **47 Posters**

Each school was gifted one poster initially. However, we had multiple requests for additional posters for their science and other classrooms. This brought us to a total of 47 posters being gifted to 10 schools.



#### **Countless Minds**

Although we can quantify how many students we spoke to directly, our goal was for these students to take this information to their family and friends. This allows our message to reach and impact so many more people.

#### COASTAL CLEANUP

Coastal cleanups. Are vital to mitigate the problem caused by ocean debris and the danger that plastic pollution poses to marine life.

There were 3 Coastal Cleanup this year, 2 at Goodman's Bay Beach and 1 at Sounder's Beach. As usual, we had a land team, water team, and data collection team. The data collection part of the beach cleanup is very important, this allows us to take away something that shows the significant impact that we had during our time there. We were able to have a positive impact on the environment, while having a great time.



### FORT FINCASTLE CLEAN-UP

We ended Earth Week with a cleanup different from our regular Coastal Cleanup. The Baha Mar Resort Foundation partnered with the Antiquities Monuments & Museums Team to host a cleanup at Fort Fincastle. Out team of 30+ volunteers cleaned the areas including around the Fort, the Water Tower, and the Queen's Staircase. Our team was able to clean hard to reach places that the normal groundskeeping crew are not able to get to.





#### RECYCLING PILOT PROGRAM



The recycling pilot project kicked off with Rosewood in November. Rosewood Baha Mar has taken an important step in their sustainability journey with the intention of reducing the impact heir waste is having on The Bahamas.

The initial phase targets the recycling of glass and aluminum cans. Special color coded bins have been placed in all F&B areas in Rosewood, and all relevant Rosewood team members have gone through recycling training. Baha Mar has partnered with WasteNot Bahamas for the collection and recycling of these materials



Through some of our prior recycling initiatives, we learned that numerous associates and departments at Baha Mar were currently recycling on their own or would like to be able to recycle. However, the main hindrance to these person was being able to get the items to NPCC. New Providence Community Center (NPCC) and the second of the control of the co



(NPCC) is the local recycling depot, that collects recycling items, then transports them to NPEP for processing.



# SAVE A GROUPER, EAT A LIONFISH

"Save a Grouper, Eat a Lionfish" was hosted by the Conservation and Sustainability team in collaboration with The Kitchen. The themed culinary experience aimed to raise awareness about an iconic Bahamian endangered species, Nassau Grouper. The event was aimed to encourage locals and guests to consider consuming invasive species like lionfish as an alternative to endangered species like the Nassau Grouper.

Locals and guests were educated about the stigma associated with eating

100% of the proceeds went to The Baha Mar Resort Foundation.













### Lend A Hand Bahamas Hydroponics

Lend A Hand Bahamas continues to collaborate with the Foundation to give back to the community. The introduction of the Hydroponics Grow Pod will provide fresh food where needed.

The Grow pod is geared toward Sustainability and Resiliencies. Focusing on growing fresh, healthy food that is free from disease, pesticides and chemicals.

# Supporting the Community

The Baha Mar Resort Foundation is committed to supporting the local community with the redevelopment of the Tom "The Bird" Grant Tennis Courts located in Yellow Elder Gardens. This supports the provision to improve a community facility that encourages youth and residents access to healthy lifestyle options, and increase community participation in tennis activities.

We look forward to future community projects.

### Carbon Footprint Program

In 2022 we signed with Preferred by Nature to be one of the first participants of their Carbon Footprint Management Program. The program consists of data collection and calculation of Baha Mar's Baseline Carbon Footprint (year 2022), and production of a Carbon Management Plan encompassing reductions, offsetting and performance monitoring and reporting.

We are currently in the data collection and baseline footprint calculation. In 2023, we aim to have our baseline calculated, management plan written, and reduction methods implemented.







### **BNT Mangrove Donation Program**

This year, we were proud to launch our mangrove restoration donation program in support of The Bahamas National Trust's efforts. Since it's launch in May, 2022 over \$1,300 has been donated to BNT for this program. We look forward to continuing and growing this project in 2023 and seeing the positive impact that these donations are having on the conservation of these important ecosystems.

# Apiary Reestablished

In 2021 five colonies of bees where welcomed. The bees are happy and healthy in their new location, and we are excited to have our very own Baha Mar honey.

Harvesting of honey is expected in the months of June/July and September/October.
